

HOW TO PLAY OMAHA

1. Texas Hold'em rules apply except:
 - A. The dealer must deal four cards to each player face downward and one at a time.
 - B. The dealer then deals three community cards from the deck and turns the cards face upward in the center of the table. Community cards are common to the "hole" cards of every active player in the pot.
 - C. After the flop, the betting continues for another round. The player sitting left of the button opens. After the opening, a player must call, raise or fold.
 - D. The dealer deals another community card face upward in the center of the table. Another betting round occurs. The dealer deals another community card face upward in the center of the table for the final betting round.
 - E. Player must use two (2) cards from their hand and three (3) cards from the community cards.
 - F. After all bets are made and if there are two or more players remaining in the game, there is a showdown.
2. This game can be played High only, High/Low split Omaha/8
 - A. For High/Low split the low qualifier may be defined at the time the game is spread. (Often the low qualifier is eight or better, unpaired, straights and flushes being ignored).
 - B. A player can win both the high and the low.
 - C. Aces play as high for the high hand and low for the low hand.
 - D. In the game of Omaha Low, the lowest ranking hand wins the pot. The lowest ranking hand is Ace, two, three, four and five of any suit or suits.
 - E. In the game of Omaha (or Omaha high) poker, the highest-ranking hand wins the pot.
 - F. In the game of Omaha High/Low split poker, the player with the best high hand and the player with the best low hand split the pot.
 - G. A player who wins high or low and ties a player for the other receives three quarters of the pot. A player may win both high and low at the same time.
 - H. If the chips contained in the pot are not divisible by two, the player with the high hand must be awarded the odd chip after the remaining pot is split equally.

BIG O

1. Omaha rules apply except that each player is dealt five cards instead of four. Players still must use two (2) cards from their hand and three (3) cards from the community cards.
